Societe Generale and the Hong Kong Rugby Union Community Foundation announced a three-year partnership to promote education and integration of disadvantaged members in the society.

The partnership this year will focus on three HKRU Community Foundationsupported projects:

- 'Breaking Barriers through Sport' programme with the Hong Kong Society for the Protection of Children supporting both local and ethnic minority children aged 16 or below and their families;
- 'A Chance to Play', with The ChickenSoup Foundation which gives 100 youth the opportunity to join local mini rugby clubs at zero personal cost; and
- the second Asian School Rugby Sevens Championship in July.

The announcement was made on 25 June at the Societe Generale Citizen Commitment Day at King's Park where over 300 Societe Generale staff and children from the charity partners attended the sport-themed festival.

In 1968, the HKRU became a founding member of Asia Rugby and remains committed to the development of the game in Asia. The HKRU has hosted the world-famous Cathay Pacific/HSBC Hong Kong Sevens since 1976 and remains the only Union to have hosted two sevens World Cups in 1997 and 2005. Founded in 1926 to deal with extreme poverty in Hong Kong, the Society focuses on providing resources to impoverished families in Hong Kong to support early-childhood development, including the provision of day care services by trained staff. Today, the Society operates 27 service units across Hong Kong include daycare crèche and nursery school services as well as residential homes for infants, as well as children's and family services centres across Hong Kong.

The ChickenSoup Foundation

Since its establishment in September 2013, the Foundation strives to provide all-rounded development to students in Hong Kong who are financially deprived and living under extreme poverty. With 100+ partners, including non-profit organizations, schools, businesses and individuals, CSF presently offers 10 well-structured and tailored programs according to the urgent and specific needs of these students in three service categories: Education, Healthcare and Inspirational Activities.

Starting with 60 kids in 2013, ChickenSoup is now serving 1,100+ children aged between 5 and 18 whose needs are diligently reviewed by social service workers and school administrators.

Services are provided daily in nine locations where the beneficiaries reside: Chai Wan, Sham Shui Po, Kowloon City, Tsuen Wan, Kwai Chung, Tseung Kwan O, Tin Shui Wai, Tuen Mun and Tung Chung. The Foundation hopes to reach out to an additional 400+ youth in Tsing Yi, Aberdeen and Yuen Long in late 2016.
